Welcome to our 23rd year of rural touring in Cheshire. We are delighted to bring you some of the very best touring theatre. music, dance and family shows to village halls, libraries, studio spaces and school venues near you.

CRTA programmes aim to appeal to a wide range of ages and tastes. Our theatre shows this Spring include the comedy of The Last Quiz Night on Earth, a return for George Egg with Moyable Feast, the satirical comedy of The Four Horseman and Quick Duck's coming-of-age comedy Yours Sincerely. For history buffs, we have an aviation and suffragette themed performance Clouds and A Brief History of Music's whistlestop tour of Western musical history. For some wonderful and personal storytelling we offer Home Sweet Home, an autobiographical show which is part circus. part theatre, and Pepper and Honey, a subtle play about cultural differences and biscuits.

Musically we bring foot stomping Truckstop Honeymoon and an inspired Austrian musician Peter Hudler with his Cello on Fire.

For children and families we have the story of the worlds first dog, Ogg 'n' Ugg.

A long, long time ago there were no dogs - there were wolves, but we didn't like them and they didn't like us. But then along came Yorkshire hunter-gatherers Ugg 'n' Ogg who palled up with the wolves and invented our best friend, the dog.

Audiences can expect flying meat bones, sabretoothed tigers, time-travelling sticks, rapping wolves, forest infernos, and lots and lots of fun before finally getting the chance to pat the world's first Dogg.

Time and Again Theatre Clouds

Time and Again Theatre, a Cheshire-based company, bring their new play, Clouds, to rural touring audiences! Clouds is a two-act play entwining the pioneering days of early aviation with the fight for women's rights and the rise of the suffragette movement.

Winifred (Freddie) Baxter is determined to become the first Englishwoman to enter an air race and fly right around the country. Her instructor, Philip, is more concerned with maintaining his own reputation as a dashing aviator, than teaching Freddie about the Blackburn Type D monoplane.

Clouds takes Britain's 'last glorious summer' and slowly draws out the simmering tensions and stark inequality lurking beneath the surface of repressed Edwardian respectability.

The set includes a scale replica Blackburn monoplane.

Hollering with all their hearts over a five string banjo and a doghouse bass, Truckstop Honeymoon live the life they sing about. Touring across three continents with a truckload of songs, Katie and Mike West tell stories about the strangeness of everyday life.

Their music combines elements of bluegrass, music hall jazz, and straight up rock'n'roll. They have released nine albums and a full length documentary film, produced over 200 albums for other artists, and received awards for Lifetime Achievement in the Arts.
