The controversial, sell out comedy show on identity, second homes, xenophobia, and bagpipes.

Cornwall is at tipping point. House prices soar, the population shifts, tensions rise. Some people see it as a separate nation, whilst others see it as a prime holiday destination and playground for the rich. Seamas Carey is confused and is desperately trying to understand.

He's watched a wave of gentrification sweep through his rural hometown. There's nowhere to live, yet second homes stand empty. He wishes Cornwall was more welcoming and inclusive but watches 'up-country' money sew division and suspicion.

Dive into the magical world of Club Origami, an immersive and interactive dance show inviting family audiences to create, imagine and explore whole new ways of thinking, playing, and moving.

Dance, fashion, and live music meet the magic of origami to sweep us up on a spirited and inspiring adventure in a land made purely of paper and play. After the show, audience members are invited to stay and play in the pool of ripped paper. Origami and movement workshops for under 5s (45min), primary school children (75min) and adults (90min), can also be provided.

We hear the story of a displaced Syrian woman.

When the dough is ready, the room fills with the smell of freshly baked bread. We share it with our friends and neighbours - and enjoy it with Svrian Meze.

When he was in Turkey, writer Kevin Dyer (Theatre Porto) was told by a Syrian refugee, ' Do not forget Syria'. This is our attempt, with baking, and a thrilling piece of drama, to keep the proud people of that country in our minds – with food and a story of hope.

This 'show' is a mix of conversation, a very moving storytelling monologue, making bread on stage, drawing, and sharing personal memories of food and family, eating meze together and socialising.

Touki Right of Passage

Touki ("journey" in the Wolof language) is a tour de force in multi-instrumental musical exultation, during which the musicians joyously switch between kora (West African harp), banjos, guitars, percussion, and other instruments, deploying powerful beats, driving grooves, and silky voices that leap from East to West Africa and across to America.

The influences are many, and rather than remaining in any one tradition, the Touki – the musical voyage itself – is the destination.

Amadou Diagne has centuries of West African music at his fingertips. Cory Seznec is a musical wanderer and uncertified ethnomusicologist. Their latest release draws together West African fables, personal stories and the social, economic, and political challenges facing both developing countries and western ones.
